As a learning organisation, the Board will offer the support and opportunity to develop, including participation on a bespoke Institute of Leadership and Management run by the museum. The museum is a fun place to work and, historically, plays an important role in the history of universal education: the Grade II/II*-listed buildings include the last remaining Monitorial schoolroom in the world, created by our founder, Joseph Lancaster.

Additionally, we welcome over 80 schools each year, offering them unrivalled immersive learning experiences. School holidays provide opportunities for informal learning for families and other audiences.
